### Statement of Need

Lung cancer remains the most common cause of cancer death in the United States. Chest wall disorders, both malignant and benign, are not well understood and often treatment for these disorders is unrecognized. Recent advances in diagnosis and treatment have considerably improved the outlook for these patients. This 7th New York Hospital Queens Thoracic Symposium will review current trends and advances in the diagnosis and treatment of these disorders for primary care physicians and all others involved in the care of thoracic patients. The new staging system for lung cancer will be presented as well as newer bronchoscopic diagnostic and staging methods. Controversies in the management of stage IIIA lung cancer will be discussed. Treatment for pectus excavatum and hypoventilation syndromes will be presented. An evidence-based review of the role of medical and surgical therapy in the treatment of these disorders will be presented. This symposium will address these key and often controversial issues in the diagnosis and treatment of lung cancer and chest wall disorders.

### Target Audience

Primary care physicians, pulmonologists, radiologists, gastroenterologists, surgeons, medical and radiation oncologists, pathologists, nurses, physicians assistants and all others involved in the care of the patient with upper airway and interstitial lung disease.

- ▶ Understanding the new lung cancer staging system and recognizing important changes from the prior system.

- ▶ Recognizing benign chest wall deformities and understanding the appropriate workup and treatment for these patients.

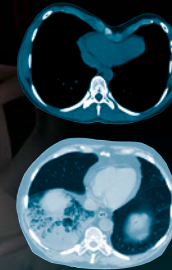

New York Hospital Queens is located on the corner of Booth Memorial Avenue and Main Street in Flushing. **From the Long Island Expressway:** take the Main Street Exit (#23), travel north on Main Street to Booth Memorial Avenue. **From the Whitestone Bridge:** take the Van Wyck Expressway to the College Point Blvd Exit; turn left on College Point Blvd and right on Booth Memorial Avenue. Follow Booth Memorial Avenue to Main Street. **IRT Flushing Line #7:** train to Main Street (last stop), then Q44 bus southbound on Main Street; stops opposite the hospital. New York Queens is located in a residential area with metered parking. Free lock-and-park spaces are available under the Van Wyck Expressway at College Point Blvd and 58th Street. This area is patrolled by NYHQ security. Shuttle buses to the Hospital run approximately every 10-15 minutes. Limited paid parking is available in our Visitor Parking Lot located on Booth Memorial Avenue opposite the Emergency Room.
